Global Mental Health

According to WHO's estimates globally 1 out of every 4 people will be impacted by poor mental health or mental illness at some point in their lives. In high-income countries. 5 out of 10 people that require mental health (MH) or psychosocial support (PSS) cannot access the care they need.
